Understanding Diamond Open Access

Diamond Open Access (OA) refers to an equitable model of scholarly publication that charges no fees to authors or readers and in which the content-related elements of publication are owned and controlled by the scholarly communities.

The Diamond Discovery Hub

The Diamond Discovery Hub (DDH) is a service that provides a central registry for Diamond OA journals in Europe. It is maintained through the European Diamond Capacity Hub (EDCH). To be included in the DDH, 6 operational criteria are considered.



6 CRITERIA FOR DIAMOND OA



Persistent identification

The journal should have a valid and confirmed ISSN.



Open Access with open licenses

All outputs of the journal should be Open Access and carry an open license that is included in the article-level metadata.



Scholarly journal

The journal should be a scholarly journal that selects papers via an explicitly described evaluation process before and/or after publication, in line with accepted practices in the relevant discipline.



No fees

The journal must not charge authors or readers. Voluntary donations are allowed but must not be a condition for publication.



Open to all authors

Any author can submit, regardless of institutional affiliation, as long as their work fits the journal's scope.



Community-owned

The journal must be owned by a public or non-profit organization that supports research and scholarship. Ownership details should be clearly stated on the journal's website.
